

## Instructions for table cloth „cherry-time“



Finished size: 90 x 90 cm (35,43 x 35,43 inch)

Finished cherry-block: 15 x 25 cm (5,91 x 9,84 inch)

Finished outer block: 25 x 25 cm (9,84 x 9,84 inch)

### MATERIAL

All fabric used in this project are patchwork fabrics with a width of approx. 110 cm (43,31 inch).



50 cm (19,68 inch) dark red, small patterned fabric for cherries and small as well as corner border squares



40 cm (15,75 inch) beige patterned fabric for background of the cherries and center of the corner squares



60 cm (23,62 inch) green with little leaves for leaves on cherry stem, little squares in outer blocks, border of the middle blocks and inner and outer border



50 cm (19,68 inch) yellow with little cherries for the middle block, squares in the outer blocks and the outer border



small amount of brown for cherry stems

furthermore you need:

1 m (39,37 inch) backing

1 m (39,37 inch) batting 248 or iron-on-batting H 630

red, green, beige and yellow quilt thread

## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Please wash and iron all fabric before using it. Especially red fabric bleeds very often the first time it is washed. Cut all fabric according to the following instructions. Use rotary cutter, quilt ruler and cutting mat for cutting. All specifications include a 0,75 (0,3 inch) seam allowance.



4 squares 16,5 x 16,5 cm (6,5 x 6,5 inch) for cherries  
16 squares 6,5 x 6,5 cm (2,56 x 2,56 inch) for outer blocks  
4 squares 11,5 x 11,5 cm (4,53 x 4,53 inch) for the outer border



4 squares 16,5 x 16,5 cm (6,5 x 6,5 inch) for outer blocks  
8 squares 8 x 11,5 cm (3,15 x 4,53 inch) for background of the cherries  
16 squares 5 x 5 cm (1,97 x 1,97 inch) for corner squares of the cherries



32 squares 6,5 x 6,5 cm (2,56 x 2,56 inch) for outer blocks  
2 strips 3,5 cm x 12,5 cm (1,38 x 4,92 inch) for border of center block  
2 strips 3,5 cm x 16,5 cm (1,38 x 6,5 inch) for border of center block  
2 strips 3,5 cm x 71,5 cm (1,38 x 28,15 inch) for inner border  
2 strips 3,5 cm x 75,5 cm (1,38 x 29,72 inch) for inner border  
4 strips with 5 cm (1,97 inch) width over the whole width of fabric for outer border  
8 rectangles 8 x 4 cm (3,15 x 1,57 inch) for leave application



16 squares 6,5 x 6,5 cm (2,56 x 2,56 inch) for outer blocks  
1 square 12,5 x 12,5 cm (4,92 x 4,92 inch) for center block  
4 squares 11,5 x 71,5 cm (4,53 x 28,15 inch) for the outer border




4 rectangles 3,5 x 11,5 cm (1,38 x 4,53 inch) for cherry stems


## ASSEMBLING THE BLOCKS

### Cherry blocks




This block is made 4 times. Draw with a pencil a diagonal line as seamline on the left fabric side onto the beige squares (5 x 5 cm/1,97 x 1,97 inch). Put them right sides together to the corners of the red squares (16,5 x 16,5 cm/6,5 x 6,5 inch). Sew along the diagonal line. Cut 0,75 cm (0,3 inch) away from the seam, fold it to the outside and iron it. Those corners are fast and easily sewn and called connectors corners.






Connect the stems with the side frames




and afterward finish it by adding them to the cherries




### Center block

Add the green strips around the yellow square (12,5 x 12,5 cm/4,92 x 4,92 inch). Afterwards add a cherry on each side of it as shown in the picture below.



### Outer blocks


This block is made 4 times and afterwards added on the left and right side of a cherry block as shown in the picture below.




Attach the red squares (11,5 x 11,5 cm/4,53 x 4,53 inch) to the yellow border strips. The two leftover yellow strips are added to the bottom of the finished corner-cherry-corner strips, as shown below.



Now you can assemble all rows and add the border.



Add the green strips as final border and finally appliqué the leaves to the cherry stems. Therefore, cut out the original pattern 8 times. How to appliqué a leaf can be read in detail in the section "Iron-on-application".



#### COMPLETION OF THE QUILT

##### To assemble the quilt layers

Layer and staple the backing, batting and quilt top onto each other. Remember that the backing and batting should be approx. 10 cm (3,94 inch) larger than the quilt top. Tape the backing onto a large plain surface (e.g. the floor, a table, ....) with adhesive tape. Put the batting on top of it and strike it out smoothly. Put the quilt top on top of it and take care that all layers are centred. To avoid shifting of the layers use pins to hold them together. Now staple heavily from the center to the outside of the top.

##### To frame quilt

With the 4 leftover strips you frame the quilt. With smaller projects quilted by hand you can add the edging before quilting. Iron the strips left sides together in half. Cut the batting and backing down to 1 cm (0,39 inch). Sew strips to front and sew it onto the back by hand.

##### To quilt

Quilt by hand around the stems and leaves with 1 mm (0.04 inch) space. Quilt a pattern into the beige squares of the outer blocks. Quilt all little squares and the inside of the centre square diagonally. Quilt a grid pattern into the cherry with the lines parallel to the outer edge.

##### Iron-on-application

Paint the leaf motif 8 times onto the iron-on-batting. Iron the batting onto the fabric, cut the leaves and iron it onto the top as shown in the picture before. Afterwards sew it on with a small zig-zag-stitch.
